#### **Grow for the Green Contest Winners**

Congratulations to **Ronnie Ragsdell** of Lawrence County and **Matt Miles** of Desha County, two of the top producers who ranked among the slate of winners in 2020's Grow for the Green Soybean Yield Contest, proudly sponsored by ASPB. During the recent Arkansas Soybean Association Annual Conference, Ragsdell was named the newest member of the 100 Bushel Club with a yield of 104.067 bu./a. using Pioneer P48A60X. Ragsdale became the 23<sup>rd</sup> producer to join the 100 Bushel Club, joining veteran member Miles who once again hit the 100-bushel mark with a yield of 116.858 bu./a. growing Pioneer P47A64X. Monitoring soil conditions is crucial to the proper management of irrigation systems. This checkoff-funded research project, led by University of Arkansas Division of

Agriculture's **Dr. Chris Henry**, utilizes monitors, sensors, computerized hole selection and surge irrigation to improve irrigation water management. With the use of Watermark™ sensors and knowledge of Arkansas's many soil types, ag research experts created a database that helps Arkansas producers make informed decisions about their irrigation.
