Soybeans were first planted in Arkansas in 1925 as an experimental crop and have since become a cornerstone of the state's agricultural economy. Now, 100 years later, soybean production spanned nearly three million acres, yielding more than 141 million bushels, with Arkansas ranking 10th nationwide in soybean production.

Established in 1971, the Arkansas Soybean Promotion Board directs soybean checkoff investments toward research, education and promotion that drive innovation, market growth and long-term demand for Arkansas-grown soybeans.

Arkansas Soybean Promotion Board

The Arkansas Soybean Promotion Board is led by nine volunteer farmer-leaders appointed by the Governor. Soybeans are Arkansas's top row crop with approximately 3 million acres planted each year, generating an annual economic impact of approximately \$2 billion. Arkansas is consistently ranked among the top ten soybean-producing states nationally, exporting 50% of its crop.
